Observe also that the gerund in dum, unlike the other two, never governs a case. It would be bad Latin to say, Parati sunt ad defendendum patriam (or, ad resistendum hosti), They are ready to defend their country (or, to resist the enemy). Obs. In Quintilian we find inter agendum, in the midst of action; and Virgil speaking of young horses says, Ante domandum Ingentes toUunt animos, Before they are tamed (literally, Before the taming) they are very fiery. Similar constructions of the gerund in dum occur in the...
